Enhancing social and emotional development (Wednesday 22nd May 6pm – 8pm)

Ensuring positive relationships between children and adults and children and their peers is fundamental to successful early years. A range of strategies that help children to enhance their self-esteem and recognise and respond to their emotions will be shared. The importance of play will be emphasised in this session.

Early language (Wednesday 12th June 6pm – 8pm)

Language acquisition does not come by chance. Every interaction in the early years can be used to develop early language when practitioners consciously focus on it. The environment, activities and adults have a major role to play in developing language; in this session we will also focus on how peer-to-peer interactions can be maximised.

Phonics (Wednesday 26th June 6pm – 8pm)

A structured approach to teaching phonics is of course essential in all aspects of EYFS. This session will explore the key ideas in teaching phonics and how they can be enhanced in interactions with children throughout the day – whichever scheme is being utilised.

Developing early mathematics (Wednesday 10th July 6pm – 8pm)

Focussing on number this session will enhance practitioners confidence in helping children to master the key skills of recognising and understanding number, counting and mathematical thinking, indoors and out.
