

The water vole was once a familiar sight on our local waterways, but has seen national declines in recent years. In an ambitious project starting in 2016, Northumberland Wildlife Trust sought to bring the water voles back to Kielder Forest in Northumberland, with help from Forestry England and Tyne Rivers Trust. Since then, over 2,200 water voles have been released into the Kielder Forest area. But its not over yet – although there are no more planned releases,

there are continuous monitoring schemes investigating the establishment of new populations and to measure the overall success of the project.

Professor de Val's research aims to develop novel strategies to modulate vessel growth. This is directly relevant to the ischemic heart, where neovascular growth is insufficient and current strategies to improve this have failed.

Having worked on different aspects of gene regulation, research now focuses on the transcriptional pathways which regulate the dynamic gene expression patterns required for correct formation and function of the mammalian vascular system.

During post-doctoral research, Sarah combined the analysis of gene enhancers (densely clustered groups of transcription factor binding motifs which regulate spatial and temporal patterns of gene transcription) with in vivo gene depletion models to describe a transcriptional pathway that regulates endothelial cell (EC) specification (De Val et al., Cell, 2008). As an independent researcher, Prof De Val's lab is focused on understanding the regulatory mechanisms controlling angiogenesis (new EC growth from existing vessels), vascular differentiation and heterogeneity.

Bat ecologist Morgan Hughes talks about how it's never too late to pursue your dreams, change your career, or sit in the rainforest by yourself, at night, under a sleeping bear in a tree. Morgan Hughes is a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Umeå in Sweden. Originally from Wolverhampton, she completed her PhD in urban bats at UoW in 2023. 

About the Researcher Development Framework (RDF)




The Researcher Development Statement (RDS) sets out the knowledge, behaviours and attributes of effective and highly skilled researchers appropriate for a wide range of careers. The RDS is for policy makers and research organisations which provide personal, professional and career development for researchers in higher education. The Researcher Development Statement is derived from the Researcher Development Framework (RDF), a major new approach to researcher development, which aims to enhance our capacity to build the UK workforce, develop world-class researchers and build our research base.



The University of Wolverhampton subscribes to the Vitae Research Development Framework. The RDF is structured in four domains encompassing the knowledge, intellectual abilities, techniques and professional standards to do research, as well as the personal qualities, knowledge and skills to work with others and ensure the wider impact of research. Within each of the domains are three sub-domains and associated descriptors, which describe different aspects of being a researcher.






